You should really take into consideration parking and accessibility at the venue of your choice as well, as if many people are driving then having to pay to park for a many hours is not really fair.

You should also consider what you want your party to include, things like food, drink and activities, as not every venue will be able to supply everything for you so you might have to take care of these things yourself. If you want alcohol to be sold to your guests then you will need to use a licensed premises and if you want food cooked and served you are going to have to look for somewhere with a kitchen and that can also accommodate your requirements.

If you have elderly people coming to your party then you should consider things like accessibility, because some venues that you might look at are not going to be suitable for everyone, as some will be harder to access than others.
